### A Message from Mayor Fries

Hello Severance!

We have had a beautiful Colorado autumn thus far and I hope you all have had a chance to get outside and enjoy our desirable Colorado weather. As of writing this note, however, winter will remind us that it is not far away.

When given the opportunity, I often talk about our "Preparedness" as a community. The context of which is typically public safety. I have spent many hours as your Mayor meeting with our staff, police department, and Weld County officials assuring that we are doing everything possible and reasonable to keep our families, homes, and property safe. Recently, our town had the need to test our preparedness. I can tell you from where I sit, and the information made available to me, we passed the test. Not only did our own police, fire, and ambulance services perform at the highest possible levels to keep innocent people safe, as well themselves, our neighboring communities arrived in full force to help, as planned. We owe Ault, Eaton, Windsor, Greeley, Weld County Sheriff, and SWAT as well as the Colorado State Patrol a huge THANK YOU for helping our local first responders.

My prayers go out to the family and friends of the two victims who died. The investigation is ongoing and as details are made available at the appropriate time, I will be sure that our community is kept informed.

Preparedness, in another context, is being informed. The Town of Severance is in the middle of budget season. As required by our town charter, the Town manager has submitted the proposed 2024 to your Town Council on time. The council will now consider the budget, offer changes and or comments during a public hearing, and then vote on the budget during our public council meeting in December. Recently, the town staff and council hosted a public open house at the town hall regarding the budget allowing citizens to ask questions and offer comments. The event was well attended. However, if you were unable to attend, there is still plenty of time to weigh in or ask questions. The proposed budget is available on the town website, and you can call any member of the town council to get questions answered or offer your comments.

### A Message from Mayor Fries

The budget is the tool the town management uses to collect and spend your tax dollars. Your opinion matters and we want to hear from you.

The Town of Severance is financially sound. We have no debt. However, we are not without our future financial challenges, and I want everyone to be prepared. Specifically, we are faced with increased costs in the treatment and delivery of our potable water, as well as the treatment and delivery of our wastewater (sewer). All water and wastewater users in Severance should expect an increase in the costs of these services for 2024. Exactly how much of an increase will be determined by the town council during an open public meeting in November, and a final vote in December. The town will continue to work with our potable water treatment partner, North Weld County Water District on the delivery of our current water use, but it is clear that both residential and agricultural growth in the NWCWD have been substantial in recent years, as well as forecasted growth in Northern Colorado. The challenge to keep up with the demand is costly and it is the users, like me and you, that ultimately pay. Additionally, the town has been working diligently for the past two years on additional options for water treatment to help reduce future demand on the NWCWD system. As you might imagine, these options are not cheap and take years to implement. Future growth will pay the price for these options. Not to pile on, but you need to know that our current wastewater treatment pond will no longer be in State Compliance in 2027 and will need to be decommissioned to the state specification.

In preparation for this known reality, several years ago the town entered into an agreement with Windsor to treat part of our wastewater, the agreement is working well. The town is exploring options to potentially increase the volume of the agreement with Windsor or build our own treatment plant. You guessed it, neither option is without increases in cost to the final users, you and me. All increases discussed here are no surprise. The only real unpredictable element has been the rate of inflation. We all have experienced increases in the cost of our water usage, at both ends, for the past couple of years. You should expect them to continue and the council will do its best with what we have to work with to keep the increases reasonable. If you have any other ideas, we are listening.

I look forward to seeing you all around town and at our upcoming community events. Please be safe, and be kind to one another.

The 1.5 MG Elevated Water Tank is currently being constructed by Landmark Structures I, LP. The Contactor has completed the 12" and 16" inlet and outlet water line installation, the concrete foundation, and the pedestal, including the concrete dome cap. The Contractor has also installed the water lines, ladder, landing, inspection rail, and cable hanging brackets within the pedestal. The Contractor has also installed the electrical and communication conduit across the site. The steel water tank ground phase began on October 6, 2023 (see photo) and will be completed this year. Work will be suspended from the end of November 2023 until April 2024 due to potential weather interruptions. The 1.5 MG Elevated Water Tank is anticipated to be commissioned by October 31, 2024.



# **SEVERANCE TREE BOARD** November 2023



As the weather gets cooler be sure to wrap your trees! A good rule of them is to have your trees wrapped by Thanksgiving and unwrapped by Easter. Why should you wrap your trees? Wrapping trees helps protect against sunscald and frost cracks, which all occur during cold, winter months.

Did you know you still need to water your trees during winter? Periodically watering can help prevent root damage from being too dry during the fall and winter months.

Woody plants with



shallow root systems require supplemental watering during extended dry fall and winter periods. Plants receiving reflected heat from buildings, walls and fences are more subject to damage. Water only when air and soil temperatures are above 40 degrees F with no snow cover.

Sec. 7-1-200. - Snow removal.

It shall be unlawful and constitute a nuisance for any person to allow snow or ice to remain on any sidewalk open to the public and abutting or adjoining the property controlled, owned or occupied by such person after twenty-four (24) hours of the last measurable snowfall or snowdrift. A notice shall state that, if the offending snow or ice is not removed from such property as prescribed by this Article on or before one (1) day from the date of such notice, the removal may be done by the Town and all costs of abatement, including the cost of inspection and all other incidental costs in connection therewith, including administrative costs, will be charged against the property, in addition to any other penalty and costs or orders that may be imposed.

# CODE COMPLIANCE AT-A-GLANCE

#### **EIGHT INCHES MAX ON** WEEDS AND GRASSES

Grasses and weeds must be kept at a height of 8" or less in yards and alleys and 9" or less in fields and undeveloped lots. In Town of Severance



#### NO NOXIOUS WEEDS

A noxious weed is a plant whose growth is restricted by law due to its destructive qualities, aggressive growth, and difficulty to eradicate. You can search for images of noxious weeds by using an internet search engine or contact us for a brochure. For more infromation about removing noxious weeds, please contact the Weld County Weed Management at 970-400-3770 or Weld.org/weeds or visit the Colorado Weed Management Association at cwma.org.

#### **RUBBISH & OUTDOOR STORAGE**

Properties must be maintained in a neat, tidy, and methodical manner. The accumulation of rubbish is not permitted. Rubbish includes but is not limited to items discarded or unusable or susceptible to weather as well as branches, yard waste, tires and appliances. Outdoor storage includes items not normally stored outdoors in a residential area.

#### TRASH SHOULD BE SECURELY STORED

Unless it's your pick-up day, your trash must be securely stored behind the front plane of the building in plastic/metal cans with tight fitting lids or tightly secured plastic bags. Take your trash to the curb no sooner than 12 hours before your scheduled pick-up day.



#### **INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLES**

An inoperable motor vehicle is any vehicle not displaying a current license plate and validation sticker, or is not operational due to flat tires, missing parts or damage. Inoperable vehicles may be stored on your property as long as they are screened from view. Car covers are not sufficient for screening.day.

#### DO NOT PARK ON YARDS

You can only park on improved areas, meaning the ground must have asphalt, concrete, rock, gravel, or other similar inorganic material with a border. Parking on all other surfaces (like grass, dirt, or bark mulch) is in violation of our local code.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL -**YOU'VE GOT 24 HOURS

Residents are required to remove snow and ice from their property's sidewalks within 24 hours after the accumulation. Remember, no letter is issued for violations, it's up to you!



#### THE WRONG WAY TO USE THE RIGHT-OF-WAY AND ANY EASEMENTS

Generally, a right-of-way (ROW) or easement is an area for public access (usually along roads) to host sidewalks, lightpoles, road signs, utility boxes and more. The ROW is reserved for the safe passage of motorists, bicycles, pedestrians, and stormwater. The most common items found illegally in the ROW or easement include, dumpsters, fencing, landscape materials. storage containers, basketball hoops, and any personal or commercial signage. Weeds and litter in the ROW or easement is the responsibility of the owner, agent owner, occupant or lessee of the property adjacent to the ROW or easement.

#### WHAT IS CODE **ENFORCEMENT?**

Code Enforcement is town staff. who enforce the Town's codes and ordinances. We focus on voluntary compliance and want all citizens to be able to live happily in their homes, whether a tenant or owner. Please take time to understand any violations found at your property and the necessary steps for compliance. Please visit townofseverance.org/municipal-code for code information.

#### **HOW WE ENFORCE CODES**

If an officer finds a violation or finds a complaint valid, a letter is sent to the property owner. If it's a rental property, a copy is also sent to the tenant and the property management company, if known. The letter identifies the specific violation and sets a final date to correct the problem. Remember there is no letter for snow removal violations. After the final date, an oficer will re-inspect the property. If the problem still exists, the officer may issue a civil citation and/or hire a contractor to do the work. The contractor's costs along with a municipal fee are billed to the property owner.

Since 1922, the NFPA has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week a national observance, making it the longest-running public health observance in our country. **During Fire Prevention Week, children,** adults, and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. This October, WSFR's **Community Risk Reduction Manager visited** nearly 1400 students in preschool, first and third grade in the district teaching fire prevention curriculum. Getting into the classroom to teach fire prevention and safety skills in these formative years can make a difference in reducing risk in our community.









From reading "The Story of Sparky the Firedog" to the younger students took a short lesson on fire safety from the older students, teaching them these skills throughout their elementary years is important to the students as well as their families. First and third graders should have come home to remind parents to check smoke alarms monthly and to make a fire escape plan with their families as well as the four steps to take when they hear a smoke alarm: Stop what you're doing, looks for 2 ways out, get LOW and GO and feel the door to GET OUT!.
